Description

Archaeological recording was carried out prior to and during the part replacement and repairs to the south boundary wall of the churchyard of All Saints Church, West Alvington. The layer sequence recorded in the exposed section was what would normally be expected within a churchyard, comprising deep overlying soils above natural ground. No in situ burials or other archaeological features were recorded. Finds included animal bones, post-medieval pottery and clay tobacco pipe.
